This major exhibition presented by Donegal County Museum and County Archives explores the emigration of women from Donegal between 1845 and 1955. The exhibition will include artefacts and archives on the theme of emigration, from the Museum

and Archives Collections, and from other Collections. Join us for an **American Wake (7 – 10pm)**. Throughout the nineteenth century American wakes were held for emigrants in the same manner as waking the dead.

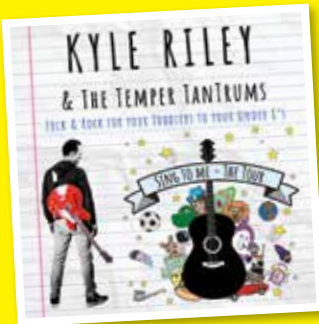

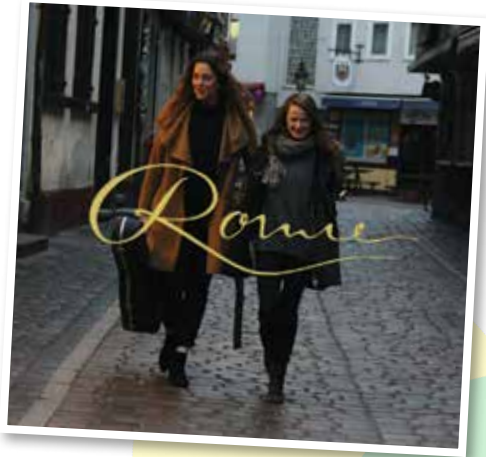
